Mopping Tips And Techniques

Regardless of the type of mop or system used, it is important to follow these simple procedures to ensure consistent floor coverage and to prevent injury:

- Safety first. Place floor safety signs visibly around the area to be mopped.
- Remove any foreign objects, trash or contaminants. Using a dust mop, clear the area of particulates.
